Background Information

The Moving to Opportunity (MTO) final, or long-term, adult survey instrument appears in its entirety further below. Immediately below is some additional background information about the instrument and the long-term evaluation more generally.

Survey Sample: We sought survey interviews with one "sample adult" from each MTO family that was selected for a head of household interview. Selected families included all Experimental (or Low-Poverty Voucher) group and Control group families and, for budgetary reasons, a random two-thirds of Section 8 (or Traditional Voucher) group families. Selection of the sample adult from each family gave precedence to adults female from the core household¹: female core head (of household), female core spouse, female baseline head if she is a core member, wife of baseline head if she is a core member, and lastly, non-female (male or unknown gender) core head.

Administration of the Survey:

- The survey was administered to a total of 3,273 adult respondents from June 2008 through April 2010.
- The instrument as presented below is the survey specifications as opposed to the actual survey instrument, which was administered via a computer program that guided the interviewer through the skip patterns.
- A Spanish version of the instrument was also available for respondents who preferred it.
- A few months before fielding began in June 2008, a small number of adults were administered a pretest version of the instrument that was largely similar to the final instrument presented below, but lessons learned from the administration of the pretest led to small changes to the instrument that were implemented before the fielding period began.
- The vast majority of interviews were conducted in person, but a small number were conducted by telephone.
- In the last two months of survey fielding (March and April 2010), respondents who were unwilling to complete the full survey instrument were given the option of completing a shortform version of the instrument². A small handful of adults opted for the short-form survey.
- To protect privacy and ensure accurate responses, two modules (Household Crime Victimization & PTSD and Substance Abuse) were administered via a headset and with the respondent using the computer him/herself to enter responses.
- The Housing Consumption and Mobility (HHC) module included a series of questions used to create an address history for all addresses from random assignment through the time of the long-term survey. A best guess of the family's residential history from administrative records and previous canvasses and surveys of MTO families was preloaded into the survey instrument, and the instrument then asked the adults to confirm or correct their full history, beginning with their current address and moving back in time to the point of random assignment.

- The order of some survey questions was randomized, and in some cases only a random subset of respondents were administered certain questions:
 - Half of the respondents were randomly assigned such that they were administered items HNB1-HNB5, HNB9a, and HNB9b in their normal location in the survey (the Neighborhoods module) while the other half were administered those items near the end of the survey as part of the Decision Making module.
 - Respondents were randomly selected for the language items that were administered as part of the Decision Making module (starting with item HDM14). For budgetary reasons, Section 8 group adults were excluded, and for practical reasons, respondents who signed a Spanish language baseline consent form, who chose to complete the survey in Spanish, and who did not consent to their interview being recorded were deemed ineligible for participation. Approximately 60% of the remaining eligible respondents were randomly selected for participation.
 - O Within the language items, there was also a random division. All selected respondents were asked to talk about their happiest moment or a happy time in their lives (HDM14-HDM15)³, and then a random half were asked to read a short story (HDM18) while the other half were asked to repeat a series of statements read aloud by the interviewer (the HDM19 series).

Variable Naming Convention: Each survey item is labeled with a three-letter acronym that corresponds to the survey module name. Each survey module acronym begins with "H" because the adult survey is a household-level survey (the adults answered questions about themselves but also many questions about the household and its members). The second and third letters of the acronym correspond to the survey module, e.g. "HC" for the Housing Consumption and Mobility module and "EM" for the Adult Employment module. Items within each module are numbered (restarting with 1 at the beginning of each module), and in some cases items in a sequence use the same number and are unique by letter (e.g. HED5a, HED5b, HED5c, etc.).

Furthermore, in the pages below, each survey question is labeled with both the raw survey data variable name as well as the field tag, which includes source survey information. For example, for the first question in the Neighborhoods module the raw survey data variable is HNB1 and the field tag is HNB1_A11_MTO, where "MTO" indicates that the question was used on the interim MTO survey and "A11" is the item number from the interim survey. Most MTO final survey questions, including those from the interim survey, were borrowed from other well-known survey such as the Current Population Survey and the National Health Interview Study. See the table below for a list of source survey acronyms. In cases where a long series of final survey questions was replicated from the interim survey or borrowed from another survey, the variable name (as well as the field tag) will include the source survey item number in the raw variable name. For example, item HEM3_C3 is borrowed from item C3 on the interim survey (field tag HEM3_C3_MTO), and item HDE6_D22 was borrowed from item D22 on the National Comorbidity Survey (field tag HDE6_D22_NCS).

Skip Patterns and Question Text Fills: The instrument included a variety of skip patterns that are all indicated below, usually in bold text in parentheses or via a checkpoint. A typical skip

pattern is exemplified by item HEM1. Respondents who reported that they did *not* work for pay last week simply moved on to HEM2, but respondents who *were* working skipped HEM2 (asking why they weren't working) and respondents who voluntarily reported that they weren't working because they were retired, disabled, or unable to work skipped to HEM22 (past questions about wages, occupation type, how they found their job, etc.). In other cases a skip pattern in the format "GO TO NEXT SECTION" routed respondents to end of the current module and thus on to the next module (see for example HED5a, where respondents who did not participate in job training in the past two years skipped follow-up questions about the type and amount of training and thus moved on to the next module, Adult Employment).

Checkpoints typically call on multiple pieces of information collected earlier in the survey and then route respondents to multiple destinations later in the survey based on that information. The mental health modules included many checkpoints, for example, because diagnosis of a mental health disorder is contingent on experiencing a certain number of symptoms. The survey asked questions about those symptoms and then included a checkpoint that routed respondents who have experienced enough symptoms to possibly be diagnosed with the disorder to additional follow-up questions and those who did not experience enough symptoms to the next section of the survey.

One key checkpoint that skipped many respondents fully past multiple modules is HSC15_SC36_CHKPT at the end of the Adult Mental Health Screener module. The screener asked a series of high-level symptom questions corresponding to the disorders in the modules that followed, and respondents who did not endorse the high-level symptom were assumed not to ever have had the corresponding disorder and therefore were skipped past the module entirely. For example, respondents who did not endorse any of the three depression symptoms (HSC6_SC21, HSC7_SCSC22, and HSC8_SC23) skipped the depression (HDE) module; those who also did not endorse the mania symptoms (HSC9_SC24 and HSC10_SC25a) skipped both the depression and the mania (HMA) modules; and so on. Respondents who endorsed none of the symptoms in the screener skipped all the way to the Household Crime Victimization module.

The instrument also contains a number of question text "fills" that were based on information that was preloaded at the individual-level into the software used to administer the survey or information collected via an earlier question on the survey. Examples of preloaded information include the respondent's gender and year of random assignment (i.e. when they enrolled in the MTO program) and the names of other household members. An example of information collected during the survey itself that was used to create fill values for later questions was whether the respondent was currently living in a house or an apartment (HHC13), which was used as a fill in HHC16, HHC18, and HHC19.

Survey Changes, Colored Text, and Post-Codes: This version of the survey reflects all changes made to the instrument during the survey fielding period. All such changes are reflected at the top of the first page of each module and are generally indicated with yellow-highlighted or strike-through text.

Blue text indicates interviewer instructions that survey respondents did not see. Text in red such as " Page 18" refers to the response booklet that respondents were given at the beginning of

the administration of the survey. For survey questions with a long list of response options, the booklet allowed the respondents to view the list directly as opposed to having to remember all of the responses as they were read by the interviewer. Other red text is notes to the programmer who created the computer-based version of the survey instrument and can be ignored (neither the respondents nor the interviewers saw this text as the interviews were conducted).

This version of the instrument also includes the post-coded survey responses for open-ended items. Some questions included a series of specific responses but also an open-ended "Other: Please specify" option. Interviewers manually entered the open-ended responses, and those responses were then converted to post-codes for analysis. In some cases the open-ended responses were mapped back to one of the original responses, but in other cases new response categories were created. Note that the respondents did not see the list of post-coded responses when completing the survey. See items HRS6 and HRS6a for an example.

More Information: This document should provide the information that most users need, but a more detailed version of the instrument that represents the output from the computer software used to administer the survey can be found in the Michigan Questionnaire Documentation System (MQDS) files at www.mtoresearch.org/instruments.html. The most useful addition in that version of the instrument is the universe field, which indicates the respondents who were asked each question and can be useful in following skip patterns. The Spanish version of the instrument is also available in MQDS format.
